Environmental Voter Project

EVP identifies environmentalists that are registered to vote, but rarely do so, and encourages them to vote in all elections, which brings climate change to the attention of politicians. **EVP** currently targets 19 states with large populations of non-voting environmentalists.

Of Further Interest

<u>MethaneSAT</u>, a groundbreaking methane emissions-monitor developed by an <u>Environmental</u> <u>Defense Fund</u> subsidiary, was successfully launched on March 4th and "will see and quantify total methane emissions over wide areas that other satellites can't and identify large emitters in places they aren't looking, paving the way for heightened accountability and faster reductions." Methane is 28 times more potent than CO2 at trapping heat in the atmosphere. Achieving significant reductions in its emissions would have a rapid and significant effect on global warming.
