The bipartisan PROVE IT Act, a powerful climate policy, was recently introduced in the Senate. It is in essence a precursor to eventually establishing a carbon border adjustment mechanism or CBAM, one of CCL's central policies.

The Washington Post's June 30<sup>th</sup> editorial on taxes made carbon pricing one of its three key recommendations, calling it "economically efficient and fair."

# **First Climate Conversation Meeting for Pierce County**

Elly Claus-McGahan— Climate Pierce County just hosted their initial meeting in Puyallup. 11 cities and the Puyallup tribe sent councilmembers and representatives, about 40 people in all. There was a lot of excitement about keeping it going in the future. Still missing a lot of small municipalities such as Orting, Bonney Lake, Buckley, Eatonville, and Sumner. Chrissy Cooley was there, talking about an EPA Climate Pollution Reduction Grant they could use in multiple ways. An expert on the Clean Buildings Act was there, the fact that there will be penalties if cities don't comply with energy saving features in buildings by 2026 was eye-opening, and lots of discussion ensued. The Peak Sustainability Group from Whatcom County shared their database which lines up cities' interests with available grants and their deadlines. A lot of potential for using this in Pierce County, especially if municipalities could collaborate.

WA 27<sup>th</sup> District Reps. Laurie Jinkins and Jake Fey are holding their Community Conversations on the following dates. These are not specifically focused on climate topics but our presence there is important to bring climate issues to attention.
