## SHOWING UP Commentary from John Doherty

Companion Tacoma CCL member Cathy Carruthers and I recently attended a luncheon for Washington Senator Patty Murray. I took the opportunity to thank her for welcoming another Tacoma CCLer, Ginny Lohr, into her office during the Education Day in DC last November.

Senator Murray expressed her obvious gratitude for that meeting and acknowledged CCL directly for the work we are doing. She emphasized the need for education of Congressional members – which I took as meaning something like: there's a lot going on in our political world and communication from groups such as CCL is an important piece in her gaining fuller understanding of the issues.

Also during the luncheon she emphasized the significance of hearing from her constituents on important issues – including hearing from constituents who offer only supportive notes for stands she's already publicly taken. She said that when she propounds a certain point, she feels empowered by having a sheaf of supportive messages in hand from her constituents on the topic.

Short version: as CCLers we are making a difference in this long and challenging climate path. Each of us makes a difference all across the activity spectrum from personally lobbying our elected representatives at one end to taking the time to regularly send emails and phone calls on important issues at the other.
