ENERGY INNOVATION AND CARBON DIVIDEND ACT

From CCL national: "Word on the street is that the Energy Innovation Act will be reintroduced into the House as soon as this month. This bill represents the (carbon fee & dividend) policy that CCL has advocated for over a decade. So we're getting an early start on supporting it. Ask your House Representative today to cosponsor the Energy Innovation Act once it is reintroduced."

Panel Discussion - "Smoothing the Road for the Transition"

The clean energy future will require us to work together as communities with all levels of government to smooth the way for a rapid transition to an efficient green electric supply grid and all-electric homes and transportation. Part of the challenge is modernizing the rules and regulations that ensure safety and proper design are updated to this new movement. Many of the governmental regulations for power production and transmission were put in place many decades ago and do not reflect the needs of today. We will invite a panel of representatives from local, county and state organizations to join us to discuss this topic.

South Tacoma Mega-warehouse issue

Earthjustice, 350, and the South Tacoma Neighborhood Council have filed an appeal over a recently-approved mega-warehouse. The filing, a copy of which was made public by Earthjustice representatives, states that the appellants "challenge the City of Tacoma's decision not to require an Environmental Impact Statement for applicant Bridge Industrial's project to build one of the largest warehouse complexes in the world in a neighborhood that is already overburdened by air pollution and other environmental harms."
